## Material List

20" x 16"

## Thread Painting Thread

40-weight rayon or polyester.

**Shrubs, tree canopy, flowers & flower stems** – Medium brown, dark green, medium olive, medium light olive, bright olive, medium red, medium yellow

**Tree trunk** – Variegated brown

- 60 weight black & white bobbin fill thread
- Clear invisible thread
- Quilting thread

## Quilting/Fabric Supplies

- **Sky** – Fat quarter sky fabric
- **Center grass** – Fat quarter light green batik
- **Foreground** – Fat quarter medium dark green batik
- **Chimney** – Scrap red batik
- **Windows & door** – Scrap white fabric
- **Clothes & posts** – Assorted scraps
- **Boulders** – Brown scraps
- **Inner Border** – Fat quarter burgundy batik
- **Outer Border, Binding & Backing** – 1 yard of spring green
- **Tulle** – 1/3 yard gray
- **Batting** – 18" x 22"
- **Stabilizers** – (5) 10" x 10", (1) 12" x 12" pieces of water-soluble stabilizer film, such as 4X by Superior or Super Solvy  
(2) 12" x 14" medium tear away stabilizer backing or Aqua Mesh or Aqua Magic (water-soluble)

## Notions

- 6" wooden or plastic machine embroidery hoop
- Basic sewing supplies – scissors, 80/12 Schmetz Microtex machine needles, tweezers, pins, etc
- Sewing machine

- Open or closed toe free motion, darning or big foot.  
*Open toe foot such as #24 or closed toe #15 for Bernina or a stippling open toe foot for Viking. It is important to see what you are stitching and where the next stitches are going so select the best foot you can for visibility. Visibility on machines with an oval clear plastic foot is practically zero. Cutting away between the 2 red lines on this type foot works on most machines. Check with your machine dealer for optional free-motion feet.*

## House Supplies

- **House siding** – 1 package white extra wide double fold bias tape (Wrights #206)
- **Roof** – 6" x 8" black batik
- **Chimney** – 4" x 8" red batik
- **Twill tape** – 15" of 1/4" (Wrights #300)
- **Double-fold bias tape** – 20" (Wrights #201)
- **Fusible interfacing**– 8 1/2" x 11" non-woven; must be able to see through it
- **Steam-A-Seam Lite** – (2) sheets 8 1/2" x 11"
- **Batting** – 6" x 8" fusible lightweight
- 10" x 11" piece of clear vinyl, heavy plastic or transparency film

## Notions

- 14" x 16" piece of foam core board
- Clover triangle iron
- Removable tape or glue, ultra-fine permanent marker
- 10" heavy thread for clothesline
- Black fabric paint, small sea sponge
- White glue, flat C-thru ruler
- Freezer paper, small rotary cutter, ruler & mat
- Basic sewing supplies, pins

**Note:** Keep Clover iron clean to avoid unwanted smudges on siding Vinyl, heavy plastic or transparency film is used as a placement and cutting guide. Steam-A-Seam is used to fuse items on house. Cut web slightly smaller than design. See manufacturers directions for fusing.
